

H.CON.RES. 160 -- DIRECTING CONGRESSIONAL CONDEMNATION TOWARD A DESTRUCTIVE, MAOIST INSURGENCY IN PERU

Dear Colleague:

The Sendero Luminoso, or Shining Path, may be the most enigmatic insurgency movement in the world today. However, one fact is certain—this terrorist organization destroys property and kills innocent individuals in an effort to polarize Peru's population and topple the democratic government of President Garcia.

H.Con.Res. 160 recognizes the dangerous nature of the Shining Path guerrillas and condemns their activities through a sense of the Congress resolution. While the transgressions of these terrorists are many and the resolution self-explanatory, I thought it might be useful to relate portions of the Shining Path's record:

- * The Sendero Luminoso are Maoist communists committed to leading Peru through a five-stage destructive upheaval culminating in a full-scale civil war;
- * An estimated 14,000 Senderista attacks, including 5,000 incidents since President Garcia took office in 1985, have claimed over 10,000 lives;
- * These fanatics have financed their campaign of terror largely through protecting and promoting the production of narcotics;
- * Far from striving to assist the poor, the Shining Path have used bombings and assassinations to block implementation of President Garcia's \$400 million social assistance plan for the 3.5 million Indians residing in the Andean highlands.

Mr. LOWERY of California submitted the following concurrent resolution; which was referred to the Committee on Foreign Affairs

CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

Expressing the sense of Congress concerning the terrorist activities of the Sendero Luminoso (Shining Path) guerrillas in Peru.

Whereas the Sendero Luminoso, or Shining Path, is an organization comprised of 5,000 revolutionaries who are fanatical terrorists dedicated to destroying all existing social and political institutions in Peru;

Whereas these murderous rebels, founded in 1970 by Abimael Guzman in the Andean highlands of the Ayacucho Province, are committed to leading Peru through a five-stage destructive upheaval culminating in a full-scale civil war;

Whereas the Shining Path is a messianic movement combining the teachings of Mao Tse-Tung with the precepts of communism as advanced by Lose Carlos Mariategui and consid-

ers half the 'fourth sword' of world revolution after Marxism, Lennism, and Maoism,

- Whereas an estimated 14,000 Senderista attacks, including more than 5,000 incidents since President Alan Garcia Perez was elected in 1985, have claimed over 10,000 Peruvian lives;
- Whereas the Shining Path has recently gone beyond attacks on government and security personnel to include attacks on civilians, business and community leaders, church officials, and foreign dignitaries and businessmen;
- Whereas the Shining Path's siege has forced the presidents of Peru to impose a state of emergency and a curfew in Lima for 17 months, and in large stretches of the Andean highlands for four years;
- Whereas Shining Path guerrillas have financed their campaign of terror and destruction largely through protecting and skimming profits from the production of coca, which is used to make cocaine, and by ensuring the continued traffic of narcotics from Peru to the United States and the rest of the world:
- Whereas this financing scheme is contradictory to both the Peruvian and American effort to stem the tide of international drug trafficking;
- Whereas the Senderistas have used bombings and assassinations to block implementation of President Garcia's \$400,000,000 plan for land reform, agricultural assistance, and social services for 3,500,000 Indians across the 110,000 square miles in the Andean highlands;

Whereas the Shiring Path's policy of polarization and anarchy seeks to prevent any type of political reconciliation and force a bloody and destructive military confrontation; and
